

MPOFU FORT FORDYCE







- Located 25km northwest of Fort
 Beaufort, the reserve spans 14,000ha,
 offering stunning views of the Katberg
 and Amatola Mountains from the
 escarpment and lower valleys.
- Trail altitudes range from 550 to 1,380 meters above sea level in the greater Amatola catchment, near Chief Maqoma's Kraal.
- Home to the legendary Blinkwater
 Monster, the reserve holds cultural and
 historical significance with early SAN
 rock paintings.
- The site of the 8th Frontier War and crucial for sustaining the Kat River, it serves as Fort Beaufort's primary water source, contributing a significant portion of runoff to this vital waterway.
- Overnight accommodation available
- Picnic and braai areas for day visitors

Embark on an enchanting journey through captivating trails, each offering a unique blend of distances and durations from 3 hrs to a full day. Traverse picturesque valleys adorned with abundant wildlife and lush forests.
