If you're a thrill-seeker, there's an adventure tour for every adrenaline level - rafting down great white waters or bungee jumping off Bloukrans Bridge - Africa's highest commercial bungee.

For a taste of the vibrance of life to be found in the Eastern Cape, do a township tour or get an introduction to traditional Xhosa rites and ceremonies on a cultural tour.



From the warm Indian Ocean to the vast plains of the Camdeboo; stretching from the foothills of the Sneeuberg Mountains in the north to the rugged Baviaans mountain wilderness in the south - the Eastern Cape is yours to explore!

There's inland snow skiing in winter; throughout the year activities along our magnificent coastline - stretching from the Tsitsikamma to the subtropical Wild Coast - for sun lovers; historical buildings, bridges, landmarks, museums, forts and stories of the one hundred years of frontier wars in Settler Country for history buffs; an abundance of wildlife at the many national, provincial and private nature reserves and seven of South Africa's nine biomes for nature lovers.

CHOOSE YOUR ADVENTURE

Bungee jumping, blackwater tubing, river cruising, whale watching, diving, sandboarding, wildlife encounters, fishing, skydiving, mountain biking, motorbiking, snow skiing, horse riding, zip-lining, surfing, hiking...

If jumping Africa's highest commercial bungee jump isn't thrill enough, how about blackwater tubing on the Storms River through the world-renowned Tsitsikamma National Park. Or try out the zip-line slides that zig-zag across the gorge - there are eight slides to choose from. South Africa's longest double zip line is in Addo - 500m long, 60m high, and up to 60km/h fast!

There's a unique treetop canopy tour in the magnificent Tsitsikamma indigenous rainforest and a guided segway tour - fun for the whole family - through the Storms River forests and quaint village.

Surf at Jeffreys Bay - amongst the best right-hand breaking wave in the world, attracting surfers from all over the globe. Or learn to surf! There are surf schools to take you through your paces at Queensberry Bay point, Yellow Sands point and beach break and the internationally recognised Nahoon Reef.

For the most exciting sandboarding adventure (on either a lie-down or stand-up board), get to the Alexandria Coastal Dune Field - world renowned as one of the largest of its kind.

The Sunshine Coast offers some of the most exciting kitesurfing spots in the Eastern Cape with suitable wind conditions generally all year round.

Game view on horseback, with an experienced guide, in the Nyati section of the Addo Elephant National Park. In the Mountain Zebra National Park, drive out with your guide to search for the elusive cheetahs. A signal from a collared cheetah is the opportunity for a closer encounter on foot!

HIKE, WALK OR MEANDER

Shaped by a dramatic coastline of rocky shores, estuaries, bays, headlands, endless stretches of beach and the magnificence of the inland mountainous regions - the Eastern Cape is a hiker's haven.

The numerous options range from strenuous trekking routes like the 20 day Eden to Addo, to scenic walks meandering across streams, past waterfalls and wildlife, and along coastal dunes.

The 42,5km, 4 1/2 day Otter Trail along the Tsitsikamma coast is probably the most popular hike in South Africa. It stretches from Storms River Mouth to the Tsitsikamma National Park. It follows the rugged, rocky shoreline rising in elevation from sea level to a height of more than 150m.

Some regard The Amatola Trail (6 days, 5 nights, 100kms) as the toughest and best hiking trail in South Africa - it's truly amazing and as challenging as they come!

Starting at Maden Dam near King William's Town, the trail traverses the magnificent Amatola Mountains, ending in the picturesque village of Hogsback. An abundance of waterfalls and mountain pools, as well as the ancient, indigenous rainforest, making up more than half the route, are the main feature of the trail.

The Tsitsikamma Trail beginning in Nature's Valley and ending 60-km further at either the Storms River Bridge or Village, is a six-day, unidirectional trail taking hikers through the heart of the Tsitsikamma Mountains.




PITCH UP FOR CAMPING & CARAVANNING


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
